Library Grateful For Clarksburg's Generosity

2011 Donations For Local Library Top Amounts Given In 2009, 2010

After the checks had been recorded from the recent appeal for funds to support the Clarksburg Library, 80 donors had given \$3,210. This represents a 13 percent increase over the amount given by 67 donors in 2010, which was \$2,840, and almost 3 percent greater than the \$3,130 donated in 2009.

The funds donated to the library through the annual fund-raising drive represent approximately 15 percent of the budget required to maintain the library; another 5 percent comes from donations. Although the largest percent of funds for keeping the building in an

operating condition comes from the wine tasting event, a large portion is also provided by the rental of the library itself to Yolo County and fees derived from renting the activity room.

Anyone wishing a copy of the whole budget for the library may submit a request to the Friends of the Clarksburg Library, P. O. 441, Clarksburg, CA 95612. Copies are also available in the library and are distributed at each annual meeting of the organization.

Of the 80 donors to this year's fund-raising drive, four were anonymous, and the other 76 are shown below.

'Wines Of Clarksburg' And Art Auction To Be Held September 18

The event is scheduled for Sunday, September 18, on the grounds of the former headquarters of the Holland Land Company at 36533 Netherlands Road, which is now owned by Kris Martin and Will Middleton.

"Every member of the current board for the Friends of the Clarksburg Library has accepted at least one of the assignments for the fundraiser," according to Mr. Smith. "And," he continued, "we are being guided by several veterans of this fund-raising event." He identified the "veterans" as Shelly Wilson, Lisa McCapes, Bob Schumacher, Rachel Frame, and Robin Murphy.

Last year's event netted the local library over \$10,000 for its operations.
